How it all started

The Sustainable World Corporation SWC was incorporated in 2017 after interactions between Nigerians and Swedish companies during the Swedish Winter Challenge.

These interactions were between individuals and Companies exchanging ideas on how to integrate services and commodities, and as such it became necessary to have a channel of communication, vetting and in some cases connecting and creating networking opportunities.



Taking a closer look at Companies coming from Nigeria it was observed that there was a need to encourage sustainability and this required a resetting of the mind set of the Business founders who are young, bootstrapping and in need of mentoring for their businesses.

Certain training and workshops such as the Itzinya Startup Academy and Family Business Workshops have been at the forefront of preparing business founders to operate their businesses with the mindset for sustainability and International trade, while creating a community and providing spaces for them to be able to work and belong to a community of like minded business founders.

This was incorporated at the initial stage with the Itzinya Incubator in 2017 where a large hall was provided for mainly graduates for the Itzinya Startup Academy while other businesses within the network rented shops within the same plaza. It was started with 4 startup company founders.

In October 2018, the Hub moved into its current location and it has been an exhilarating journey of startup founders finding a welcome at the SWC Hub environment, each one of them a part of something budding.

While working on their ideas, they experience the freedom to lean into the community for support, encouragement and inspiration and this gives us the greatest pleasure and fulfillment to watch businesses move from stage to stage.

We face challenges on a daily bases however, these challenges have only served to fuel our determination to keep the Hub going.

The Hub currently houses 4 resident businesses and graduates Incubating their businesses with a capacity to house more.



The Hub has provided more that just a co-working environment, it has provided a safe space for stories of failures to be shared over fika, to share frustrations and gain encouragement, through mentoring, coaching and facilitated growth promotion sessions.

There is so much potential. So much more we can and will do, but here, we stop to count our achievements, celebrate our milestones!



EVENTS

In 2019 the SWC Hub has hosted events and training sessions within its facilities. In April it was the host for the Family Business week, Which featured a Family Business awareness and Consultation sessions.
