The SWC innovation hub Boardroom has made it very convenient for both the Hub occupants and clients from outside the hub to make use of the boardroom for their business events.

To access the boardroom, a booking process is prioritized and handled by the Front Desk Admin Officer. As the Front Desk Admin, my job description includes making reservations and making sure there are no clashes in the bookings.

My work Is both important and enjoyable. I try to make the experience very pleasant and covenient for the prospective clients and Hub residents. Bookings can therefore, also be done online by clicking on calendly.com/merakisolutionsltd. After booking details is confirmed an invoice is sent to the client(s) and a receipt on payment.

The client(s) receive reminders on their scheduled booking dates via Whatsapp/Emails.

On the day of the event, the boardroom is set up according to the clients' request and visitors are directed to the event location. Other requests like tea/lunch orders are set up in the kitchen.
